TO ENTER:

Non-perishable entries (<u>Handiwork</u>, <u>Heritage Skills and Visual Arts</u>) should be brought to the Madison County Extension Office, 230 Duncannon Lane, Richmond, KY on Monday, July 22, 2024, from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm at If items are excessive in size, awkward to handle, or weigh over 40 lbs., please contact the Extension Office to make alternate arrangements as items will be transported by extension staff to the fairgrounds for judging. If you have questions, please contact the Madison County Cooperative Extension Service at (859) 623-4072.

Perishable entries (Garden, Horticulture, Canning, Honey, Eggs and Foods) must be dropped off at the Madison County Fairgrounds in Willis Hall, 3237 Old Irvine Road, Richmond, KY, on **Wednesday**, **July 24**, **2024**, **from 2:00 to 6:00 pm**.

We encourage those with multiple entries to pick up entry tags at the Extension Office prior to July 22.

Entries will be on display in a climate-controlled facility from day of entry through **Saturday**, **August 3**, **2024**, **day of pickup**.

RULES:

- Only Madison County residents can enter items to be judged, except for entries into the Honey Department, which is open to everyone. Please bring a picture ID with current address.
- No group entries will be accepted.
- All entries must have been completed since the previous county fair and be original work (not from a kit or purchased).
- Limited to one entry per class for each Exhibitor, <u>including</u> "other than listed" classes. The "Other than listed" class <u>must</u> be an entry that does not qualify under any other listed class in the division.
- Items entered will not be able to be viewed until the fair opens on Friday, July 26, 2024.
- All entries must be picked up on Saturday, August 3, 2024, between 9:00-11:00 a.m. No early pickup allowed. Premium money will be disbursed at that time. Exhibitors must retain duplicate part of entry tag to identify and reclaim article at pick up. Any items not picked up during this time will be available at the Madison County Cooperative Extension Office during normal business hours, 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., for a period of two weeks, starting August 5th.

The Fair Board and the Madison County Cooperative Extension Service, and their volunteers, shall not be held responsible for any loss or damage to any item entered.

Produce exhibits must be displayed on a heavy disposable plate and enclosed in a large zip lock bag.

Flower Specimen - A single plant bloom, spike or spray with foliage in a glass bottle or vase. We are not responsible for vase or bottle. Keep in mind exhibits will NOT be judged the same day they are entered.
